Our runs this weekend will take place on open roads in South Australia: all participants are responsible for ensuring that their vehicles are in suitable condition to take to the road. Safety is of paramount importance: please exercise due care when driving, and be sure to obey all road rules. On occasion we may have marshals to indicate direction at corners - if so please note that they have this one role only. Do not follow any directive that you feel may compromise your safety.

Breakdown Procedures

Pleasant company, pleasant roads, pleasant scenery, pleasant autumn weather ... surely the chance of breakdown is close to zero? Never-the-less on each of the organised runs we will have a "tail end Charlie" to assist if breakdowns do occur. David Hatcliffe and son Ryan will be assisting with a motorcycle trailer and a full set of tools, however 'terminal' breakdown may require recovery of the car to Strathalbyn. Because the runs are for the most part within 20 km of Strath, we can either get you back to town to pick up your trailer, another trailer, or by contacting the RAA. Your choice. The RAA contact in Strath is at Gilbert Motors (08) 85362066. If necessary, a disabled vehicle can be returned to Ross Bartlett's yard (see below). We see no need to follow the rally in a car towing a trailer.

While in Strathalbyn

While we're in town, please try to move around and visit some of the local businesses. Of particular interest are the antique shops of the High Street (a short drive or a pleasant walk from the park at Colman Tce), and be sure to visit the Strathalbyn Craft Fair which is on this weekend in the Town Hall, also on High Street.

Trailers and trailer etiquette

Member Ross Bartlett has offered his secure yard for parking of cars and trailers. The address is 2 King St, Strathalbyn. King St runs north-south between Coronation Rd and the Goolwa Rd, just off the coloured street map in your rally pack. To get there from Colman Tce: turn left into Commercial Rd, right into Mill St, left into West Tce, right into Coronation Rd, and left into King St. Ross's yard is half way down the street on the left (east) side. The gates of the yard will be open most of Saturday, but will be locked at dusk. If you don't need your trailer for the weekend, please try to get in to the yard as early as possible.
